WHAT STORIES THE WALLS TELL: CAVE

ART AND ITS MAKERS - February 17-21 (during Public School Winter Break) at Bright Hill Literary Center's Education Wing, 94 Church Street, Treadwell, NY. Space is limited, so early registration is advised (registration begins January 2 with a final deadline February 3; registration forms will be available on BHLC's website by January 10). All Bright Hill Literary Workshops for Kids include writing and visual arts and incorporate science and math for projects; we believe in STEAM.

WHAT STORIES THE WALLS TELL:
CAVE ART AND ITS MAKERS will take
the students on a virtual journey to Indonesia,
where 44,000-year-old cave drawings that
tell a story were found; the drawings feature
a hunting scene with jungle buffaloes and wild
boars stalked by part-human and part-animal
hunters carrying spears and ropes. We will learn
about these and other cave art during the week,
then build our own papier-mâché caves with drawings and/or make animal masks and write our own
legends, riddles, and poems about them. On the last
day of the workshop, we will present an exhibit and
program to parents and friends.

THE WORKSHOP takes place from 9 am - 2:30 pm; Bright Hill will provide morning and afternoon snacks, but kids should bring their own bag lunches.

CHILDREN ages 6 - 14 (first grade through 7th grade) are welcome to the workshop, which is designed and led by Bertha Rogers, master teaching artist and founding director of Bright Hill. The fee for each five-day workshop is valued at \$250, but Bright Hill is only charging \$160, plus full and partial scholarships to permanent residents of Delaware and Otsego Counties (Delaware Academy /Delhi Central School students receive full scholarships, provided by the Abraham Kellogg Educational Fund. Registration is limited to 22 students.

Participants vote on books to read and discuss; each student gets a free copy of the book. This is a FREE PROGRAM of Bright Hill Press & Literary Center, but students must sign up in advance and must come to at least 2 of the 3 sessions for each book.
